MANDATORY MATERIAL – RECYCLING

As mandated by the 2006 Essex County Solid Waste Management Plan, all homes, condominiums, townhouses, apartments, etc. are required to recycle the following materials:

- Newspaper
- Mixed paper (junk mail, office paper, magazines, etc.)
- Corrugated cardboard and containers
- Glass food and beverage containers
- Aluminum beverage containers
- Plastic containers (PET or PETE type 1 and type 2)
- Steel / Tin containers (food containers, etc.)
- Leaves
- Used motor oil*
- White goods and various metals (refrig, washers, dryers, stoves, etc.)
- Lead acid batteries*
- Ferrous Metal Scrap (iron, steel and stainless steel)
- Electronics (computers, monitors, TV's, etc.)**

** - Accepted at the Essex County Computer & Electronics Collection Days only

RECYCLING WORKS

According to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection nearly 10.3 million tons of material was recycling by New Jersey residents. While this may seem like a lot, there is more that we can, and must do.

Essex County's 2006 Solid Waste Management Plan amendment implements new recycling strategies to increase the rate of recycling so we the 50% municipal solid waste recycling goals established by the State of NJ. Reaching this goal will reduce disposal volumes, air and water pollution, natural resource utilization, greenhouse gas emissions and help expand the life of our County disposal assets.
