COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER & SUNSHINE STATEMENT

The August 15, 2017 Meeting of the Roseland Mayor and Council was called to order at 7:30 PM by Mayor Duthie. Adequate notice of the meeting was provided in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Act in that the date, time and location of the meeting were included in the Annual Meeting Schedule, was sent to the official newspapers, posted on the public bulletin board in the Municipal Building and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk.
