## **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Roseland resident William Tedesco asked for an explanation of Resolution No. 84-2016 and Resolution No. 87-2016. Mrs. Chumacas explained that one resolution is authorizing preparation work to be done on various baseball fields to prepare infields for new clay, and the other resolution is authorizing preparation work to be done on various baseball fields to prepare outfields for new turf.

## **ADOPTION OF RESOLUTIONS**

Councilman Tsilionis made a motion to approve the twelve resolutions and the two consent agenda items:

Resolution No. 82-2016 awarding the 2016 annual service contract for the Zetron 911 System to Northeast Communications under State Contract 83924 for an amount not to \$2,800.00

Resolution No. 83-2016 awarding the 2016 the telephone maintenance contract to Johnston Communication under State Contract 80802 at a rate of \$125.00 per hour for an amount not to exceed \$3,000.00

Resolution No. 84-2016 authorizing the services of Robert W. Wogisch for startup prep work on Thomas J.O'Beirne Field using Open Space Trust Funds in the amount of \$1,500.00 and on Harrison Field using Recreation Trust Funds in the amount of \$1,800.00 for a total cost of \$3,300.00

## **MAYOR'S REPORT**

Mayor Duthie appointed a judging committee consisting of Council members Jacobs, Leonard, and Tolli for the Louis Bay 2nd Future Municipal Leaders Scholarship competition. The scholarship is available to West Essex High School juniors and the deadline for Roseland residents to submit their application is March 15<sup>th</sup>.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### PUBLIC WORKS

Public Works Superintendent Gary Schall recommended that Council award the contract for the Fire Department Apparatus Room Roof Replacement Project to Patwood Roofing Co., the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, for a total of \$91,000.00. Council agreed to put a resolution to award the contract on the next agenda.

Mr. Schall recommended that Council award the contract for Lawn Maintenance to D'Onofrio & Sons Landscaping, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. Mr. Schall recommended that the contract be awarded for the Base bid of \$22,180 for grass cutting at municipal properties, plus Alternate B in the amount of \$135/hour for property maintenance work ordered by the Zoning Officer, plus Alternate D in the amount of \$880 per occurrence, for cutting the Dockrell property. Council agreed to put a resolution to award the contract on the next agenda.

Mr. Schall recommended that Council award the contract for Water Analysis Contract Services to Agra Labs in Dover, NJ, the only compliant lab to submit a quote. Council agreed to put a resolution to award the contract on the next agenda.

## **PUBLIC SAFETY**

Councilman Jacobs suggested deferring the discussion of the Do Not Block the Box question to the next meeting as he is awaiting a response from Essex County.

#### **RECREATION**

No report

#### CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Councilman Leonard presented a list of people who have recently left volunteer boards and suggested that the governing body present proclamations. Council discussed completion of one full term on the board as the minimum criteria for determining who should receive a proclamation. Council agreed that the liaison to board or committee should make the recommendation to Council to award a proclamation.

Councilman Leonard discussed a proposal to install new carpeting in the police department at 15 Harrison Avenue, the public works offices at 300 Eagle Rock Avenue and the OEM office at 140 Eagle Rock Avenue. Council decided to continue the discussion at the budget meeting scheduled on March 8<sup>th</sup>.

#### **PUBLIC AFFAIRS**

Council agreed to give the students who are members of the Municipal Youth Guidance Committee first refusal when volunteers are needed for Borough activity.

Clerk Watkins asked for clarification on Council's intentions for certain amendments to the sign ordinance as proposed by the Zoning Officer. After discussion, Clerk Watkins indicated that he would incorporate Council's suggestions and prepare a draft ordinance.

#### **ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE**

Clerk Watkins explained some procedural and financial difficulties that have arisen in the implementation of the new Solicitation ordinance that was enacted in 2015. After discussion, Mr. Watkins was authorized to prepare a draft ordinance to implement corrective amendments.

## **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Mr. William Tedesco asked if signs are required at the entrances to the Borough advising solicitors of the requirement to obtain a license. Mayor Duthie advised that such signs are not required.

Mayor Duthie suggested that the March 15<sup>th</sup> meeting be cancelled because key advisors will be away on vacation. After discussion, Mayor Duthie made a motion to move the business scheduled for the March 15<sup>th</sup> meeting to the next scheduled meeting on April 5<sup>th</sup>. The motion was seconded by Councilman Tsilionis and approved by a 4-0 voice vote (Smith, Vidovich absent).
