This meeting was also available via Zoom conference call.

Mayor Spango led the salute to the flag.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Councilman Freda made a motion to approve Resolution No. 273-2021 Approval to Close to Executive Session to discuss the following:

The motion was seconded by Councilman Bardi and approved by a 5-0 voice vote (Tolli absent). Council adjourned executive session at 6:42 PM. Mayor Spango read the Sunshine

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES

Councilwoman Fishman made a motion to introduce Ordinance No. 27-2021: "An ordinance to amend Chapter BH 11 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Roseland entitled "Animals" to establish requirements for the proper disposal pf pet solid waste so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for failure to comply". The motion was seconded by Councilman Trillo and approved by a 5-0 voice vote (Tolli absent). The public hearing will be held on November 23, 2021.

Councilwoman Fishman made a motion to introduce Ordinance No. 28-2021: "Bond ordinance providing for the acquisition of a fire engine for the Roseland Volunteer Fire Department in and by the Borough of Roseland, in the County of Essex, New Jersey, appropriating \$675,000 therefor and authorizing the issuance of \$641,250 bonds or notes of the Borough to finance part of the cost thereof.". The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Perrotti and approved by a 5-0 voice vote (Tolli absent). The public hearing will be held on November 23, 2021.

The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Perrotti and approved by a 5-0 voice vote (Tolli absent).

MAYOR'S REPORT

Council discussed a request received by the mayor to make a change to the B-2 Zone District to allow food trucks to operate at service stations. Discussion of the Engineer's report on the drainage issues on Second Avenue was postponed, pending receipt of the report. Council approved a change to the Borough's noise ordinance to restrict use of landscaping and yard maintenance equipment from 8:00 AM until 7:00 PM on weekdays, and from 9:00 AM until 6:00 PM on weekends. The proposed changes to the ordinance will be on November 23rd agenda for introduction. Council agreed to permit Hometown Hero banners to be installed on utility poles at appropriate times. The cost of the banners will be born by the sponsor of the individual banners.

Mayor Spango displayed a copy of the proposed 2022 Roseland Borough Calendar. The calendar will now be sent to the printer. The trunk or treat had to be postponed from Saturday, October 30th to Sunday, October 31st due to the weather. Judging of the cars will take place online. Mayor Spango thanked John Matheis for his assistance with accommodating the date change. Mayor Spango was pleased to announce that Council will be able to present story time again this year, despite the equipment losses experienced by the videographer as a result of Tropical Storm Ida. The Christmas tree lighting ceremony will take place on December 4th from 5:00 PM until 9:00 PM. Lawn activities are scheduled from 5:00 PM until 7:00 PM. Santa will arrive at 7:00 PM, and strolling characters and carolers will perform, and pictures with Santa will take place from 7:00 PM until 9:00 PM.

The Borough is awaiting additional details from the Borough Engineering for the proposed turf fields and upgrades to the snack shack. Mayor Spango announced that Roseland's Clean Community Day has been scheduled for November 20th from 8:00 AM until 4:00 PM to clean up Bond Force Park. Anyone interested in participating should R.S.V.P. by November 11th. In addition, a number of local contractors have volunteered their time and equipment to repair the eroded stream bank adjacent to Bond Force Park, and the Borough will be purchasing the materials. Refreshments will be available.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Councilman Bardi reviewed the Borough's 2021 Best Practices Inventory. A minimum score of fifteen (15) is required in order to receive 100% of the State Aid. The Borough's score on this year's inventory is twenty-one and one half (21.5).

COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND SHARED SERVICES

REDEVELOPMENT AND LEGAL

Councilwoman Fishman announced that the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has approved a Covid-19 vaccine for children between the ages of five and eleven. Vaccines will be available from the County at their three vaccination sites at the Sears building in Livingston, the K-Mart building in West Orange, and Essex County College in Newark. Vaccination site hours are 8:00 AM until 5:00 PM, Monday through Saturday.

Mayor Spango added that Resolution No. 285-2021 was approved earlier in the meeting, authorizing the mayor to sign a hold harmless agreement with MediMobile to provide free Covid-19 testing to local residents. The test site will be located in the Bond Force building and will be open on Thursdays from 8:00 AM until 8:00 PM.

The new senior society held their first meeting recently. One hundred and twenty seniors have signed up to date. The society is planning to conduct a meet and greet in the near future.

PUBLIC WORKS

Councilman Freda reminded residents that the Department of Public Works (DPW) is continuing the curbside pickup of leaves. The Borough is still planning to begin the water tank painting project within the next two weeks. During the most recent test of taking the water tank offline, the system pressure remained stable. An inspection company hired by the Borough has located two buried water valves, one or both of which may be closed and causing some of the pressure problems. Additional investigation is planned.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Councilwoman Perrotti thanked OEM Coordinator Matheis for his efforts during the recent trunk or treat. Mrs. Perrotti cautioned residents to remove the keys from parked cars and make sure to lock the doors. Mayor Spango added that almost every car stolen in Roseland over the past couple of years had the key fob in the car.

RECREATION

Councilman Trillo congratulated Councilwoman Fishman and Councilman Freda on their re-election to Council. The Roseland school superintendent recently announced her retirement. Before she retired, she made the gym available for fall/winter recreation programs. Basketball registration is taking place now. Basketball season will start the week after Thanksgiving. Soccer season is wrapping up, and Mr. Trillo announced that one team won their championship, and one or two more teams are in the running to win their respective championships. Everyone has been having a great time at the Friday night kickball games.
