This meeting was also available via Zoom conference call.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Councilwoman Fishman made a motion at 6:32 PM to approve Resolution No. 84-2022 Approval to Close to Executive Session to discuss the following:

PUBLIC HEARING/ADOPTION OF ORDINANCES

Clerk Watkins read Bond Ordinance No. 02-2022 by title only for the second time: "Bond ordinance amending section 3(a) of bond ordinance numbered 11-2011, as amended by bond ordinance numbered 10-2017 and supplemented by bond ordinance numbered 15-2018, of the Borough of Roseland, in the County of Essex, New Jersey, finally adopted September 20, 2011, as amended August 15, 2017 and supplemented November 13, 2018, in order to amend the description of the project." Councilwoman Fishman made a motion to open the public hearing on Ordinance No. 02-2022. The motion was seconded by Councilman Bardi and approved by a 5-0 voice vote (Freda absent).

Resolution No. 79-2022 approving the proposal from Boswell Engineering to provide engineering services for fire department and Roseland First Aid Squad garage improvements at a cost of \$13,500.00

Resolution No. 80-2022 approving the proposal from Remington & Vernick Engineers to provide consulting engineering services for 2022 emergency repair contracts at a cost of 12,200.00

Resolution No. 81-2022 Emergency Temporary Budget

Resolution No. 83-2022 authorizing the mayor to sign an agreement with Didja Local Broadcast Services

The motion was seconded by Councilman Trillo and approved by a 5-0 voice vote (Freda absent).

CONSENT AGENDA

Councilwoman Fishman made a motion to approve the three items on the Consent Agenda:

Accept cadet application of Briana Puli for the Roseland Volunteer Fire Department

Accept application of Brendan Riedmuller for the Roseland Volunteer Fire Department

The motion was seconded by Councilman Trillo and approved by a 5-0 voice vote (Freda absent).

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Spango announced that the Mayor's Ball is scheduled for August 22, 2022 at the Hanover Manor. The theme for the event will be a casino night. Additional volunteers wishing to serve on the planning committee are welcome. Three summer concerts are being planned this year. One concert will be in July, and two will be in August. Mayor Spango acknowledged Mr. Thomas O'Beirne who submitted a \$10,000.00 sponsorship for the concerts. Summer movies are also being planned.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Councilman Bardi reported that the committee is recommending that the vending machine licensing ordinance be amended to include a license application fee deadline of January 31st each year, and a 10% per month late fee. Council agreed with the recommendations and an ordinance amendment will be added to the March 15th agenda. A fourth budget meeting is scheduled for this Saturday at 9:00 AM at 140 Eagle Rock Avenue.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND SHARED SERVICES

Councilwoman Tolli directed residents to the Borough's website to see pictures of members of the Municipal Youth Guidance Subcommittee making sandwiches at the first aid squad building for homeless people. March is Prevent Child Abuse Month. Blue ribbons and blue pinwheels will be erected around town in observance of Prevent Child Abuse Month. Mrs. Tolli provided some trivia noting that March 5th marks the anniversary of Oreo cookies, and March 12th is National Girl Scout Day. A St. Patrick's Day celebration for seniors has been scheduled for March 11th at the Hanover Manor. The cost to attend is \$10.00. Members of the Municipal Youth Guidance Subcommittee will assist with the Bunny Trail in April.

REDEVELOPMENT AND LEGAL

PUBLIC WORKS

Councilwoman Perrotti reported that the Borough plans to install a one hundred thirty-four thousand (134,000) gallon reserve water storage tank on the same property as the main water storage tank. The Borough's water engineer has proposed three potential locations for the new tank. The proposal will be forwarded to members of Council for review. Mrs. Chumacas noted that the bond ordinance amendment approved earlier in the meeting did not increase the amount of the bond ordinance, but simply added the installation of the water tank

and a generator at one of the pump stations to the description of work covered by the bond ordinance.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Councilwoman Perrotti welcomed Briana Puli to the Roseland First Aid Squad and Brendan Riedmuller to the Roseland Fire Department. Mrs. Perrotti expressed condolences to the Silvia family on the passing of Joseph Silvia, long time member of the Roseland First Aid Squad.

Councilman Bardi questioned if the traffic light on Passaic Avenue at the entrance to Noecker School could be programmed to blink on the weekends. OEM Coordinator Matheis advised Council that New Jersey law requires traffic lights at schools cannot be blinking lights. OEM Coordinator Matheis will check with the County Engineer to see if the sensors are working properly, or if there is a possibility to install new camera sensor technology on the light.

RECREATION

Councilman Trillo announced that basketball season is wrapping up. Roseland has three of four teams still in contention for league championships. Registration for all of the spring sports is open on Community Pass. Council discussed whether it was appropriate to rescind the temporary Covid-19 sanitizing fees that were adopted pursuant to Resolution No. 138-2021. Council is agreeable to rescinding the fees. Before rescinding the sanitizing fees, Mrs. Chumacas will check with the health officer to make sure that the extra sanitizing covered by the fees is no longer necessary.

Mr. Trillo asked that the Department of Public Works (DPW) establish a checklist for cleaning the public restrooms at the recreation fields to establish accountability for uncleaned facilities. Mr. Trillo also suggested that lettering be installed on the Fernwood Field dugout.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilwoman Perrotti made a motion to approve the January 29, 2022 budget meeting minutes, the February 1, 2022 caucus meeting minutes, and the February 1, 2022 executive session minutes. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Fishman and approved by a 5-0 voice vote (Freda absent).

Councilman Bardi made a motion to approve the February 15, 2022 executive session minutes. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Fishman and approved by a 4-0 voice vote with Councilman Trillo abstaining from the vote and Councilman Freda absent.
